SCHOOL COUNCIL RECENT DECISIONS:

A new pedestrian gate in the boundary fence behind the Community House will be installed by the start of Term 4. This will allow access for those families who park in the carpark beside the Preschool centre. A pathway inside the school fence will be developed next Term. The installation of LED lighting throughout the school is currently being investigated. It would require over 400 bulbs and tubes being replaced with LED lights. Room 4, Miss Casey's room has been converted to LED lighting so that we could see what difference it would make within a classroom. They project a very white light and run on only 25% of the electricity. Please have a look and let me know your opinion.

SCHOOL BANKING FOR STUDENTS:

PORTABLE BUILDING UPDATE:

Currently it is intended that the portable building will be removed from the school grounds during the holidays and taken to another school. There is some restoration work that will need to be undertaken in the corridor where the portable once stood to make the area secure.

For everyone's safety, I strongly suggest that no one is in the school grounds when large trucks and cranes are lifting and removing the portable buildings.

PUPIL FREE DAY NEXT TERM

Each year schools are provided with four Pupil Free Days for staff to use for professional development. One of these days is always the day before students begin at the start of the year. The other three can be taken when appropriate for the staff.

In Term One the day was used to consolidate the work undertaken last year with the Differentiated Curriculum.

In Term 3 the staff was trained at Level 2 First Aid standard.

The next, and final Pupil Free day, will be on Monday, 27th October. The staff will focus on developing a greater understanding of the major computer based programs that are used to enhance student learning across the school. Some of the programs to be explored include: Mathletics, Skoolbo, Rainforest Maths, Sunshine Online, Study Ladder and EduStar.

STUDENTS ON THE MOVE:

At this time of the year the budget provided to the school for the following year from DEECD is released. It is calculated on, in part, by the number of students within the school. From this information the school calculates how many staff it requires and can afford. Could any families who anticipate they may be leaving the school, excluding those with only Grade 6 children, please notify the office as soon as possible. The number of grades and how many students will be in each of them, will be formulated early next Term. This will be based on our anticipated enrolments, rooms available and budget.

SCHOOL BAND:

FRUIT & VEGETABLES SPECIAL OFFER:

Commencing next Term families and staff will have the option of purchasing a box of fruit and vegetables from the school on a weekly basis. The items are fresh from the market and each box contains many of the regular weekly produce.

A special flyer will be sent home next Term. Many staff and parents who saw the sample box said it was good quality food, it



contained many items they would normally buy and it was great value for the price. The boxes will be ordered and paid for by Fridays and they will be delivered by the following Tuesday. Due to their 15 kgs weight, they will need to be collected by an adult.
