2024 - FEES & PAYMENTS

The new year of 2024 will see the Goonawarra Primary School community continue to grow and evolve, offering rich and diverse learning opportunities for our students. If you are a new family joining us next year, we welcome you to our school community and hope that you and your child(ren) enjoy your time at GPS over the coming years. If you are an existing family returning next year, we look forward to seeing you refreshed in the New Year.

This letter outlines GPS's fees and payment arrangements for 2024. School Council, made up of teaching staff and parents, is very proud of our school and the achievements of our students. It is within the context of support for the great work of our teachers, and the continued success of our students, that the annual review of payments is undertaken. Affordability is a prime consideration, as are the educational outcomes available to our children. Victorian legislation and Education Department policy requires that the standard curriculum is delivered free to all students within government schools, and GPS supports this fundamental principle of access to free education. The school fees set and endorsed by the School Council are for programs and materials beyond standard curriculum delivery – including health and wellbeing, online resources and medical care to enhance the educational opportunities/experiences available to our students and support the work that makes GPS great.

We appreciate your contribution in enabling us to deliver a high-quality, multi-faceted program that nurtures the development of the whole child and provides a rich and engaging learning foundation for all students.

PART A: CURRICULUM CONTRIBUTIONS

These contribution requests include the cost of student yearly subscriptions to access Mathletics (Numeracy Platform P-6), Art - paint, crayons, canvas, glitter, coloured paper, Maths Online, Bug Club, Student Wellbeing Journals, printing and photocopying of learning materials. These contributions support the school in continuing to run effective, enriching and engaging programs for our students. We rely on parent contributions to support our programs.

PART B & C: Extra-Curricular Items and Activities

Goonawarra Primary school offers a range of items and activities that enhance or broaden the schooling experience of students and are above and beyond what the school provides in order to deliver the Curriculum. We will provide an events calendar for all year levels which will provide information around dates, locations and prices of the excursions and incursions booked, in term one this is outside the parent payment arrangements.

PART D: Tax Deductible or Contributions (non tax deductible)

Goonawarra primary school continues to welcome your voluntary contributions to support our school. You can make a general voluntary contribution that goes towards all of our school's important priorities for 2024 as well as providing additional activities and services for all students as stated below.

Voluntary financial contributions by parents are an increasingly important source of funding for the school and assist in ensuring our facilities and programs operate at a high standard. As for all Victorian State Schools, the funding provided for the delivery of the standard curriculum varies from school to school and is adjusted annually according to the Index of Community Socio-Educational Advantage (ICSEA). This means that schools in areas with children with higher needs receive increased funding while schools in areas with higher socio-economic and educational profiles receive less funding.

We hope that many more families will help to grow this important source of school funding next year. For 2024, if it is within your family's means, please consider contributing. Voluntary contributions alleviate pressure on the main funding sources, enabling the school's core budget to remain focused on delivering enriched educational outcomes for all of our children. If we all give a little, together, our impact can be great.



Voluntary financial contributions can be made as a non-deductible general voluntary contribution, or as a tax-deductible contribution to the School's Library or Building Funds. School Council would like to put contributions to the Building Fund on hold and has set the following expenditure goals for voluntary contributions:

2024 Library Fund Goal

Tax-deductible contributions made to the Library Fund are used for the acquisitions and operations of the school library, ensuring that it remains a well-resourced and vital educational hub for our students and families. A key goal for 2024 is to refresh and expand the range of take-home reader books for students across all year levels to inspire life-long readers.

2024 Outdoor Play equipment

The primary goal for 2024 is for funds to be directed towards the staged development of the school's indigenous passive area. This is an ambitious project which will see the school's wonderful grounds enhanced with creative, engaging, and nature-focused play. This work is expensive and not directly funded by the department, so will be financed through fundraising efforts, donations and any grants we are able to obtain. Generous donations will broaden the scope of works able to be undertaken in 2024, enabling better play and outdoor learning spaces sooner this is an exciting development for the children and the whole school community.

SUPPORT OPTIONS FOR FAMILIES

The School Council recognises everyone's family circumstances are different, and as such our school is committed to supporting parents and guardians who are experiencing either short term or long term hardship and may be unable to make the requested payments on time. If these circumstances apply to your family, School Council encourages you to have a confidential discussion with Dolores Giordimaina or Assistant Principal - Carla Cropley. The school can offer alternate payment options to assist your family and provide details about financial and other types of support that may be available. FREE INSTRUCTION

- Schools provide students with free instruction and ensure students have free access to all items, activities and services that are used by the school to fulfil the standard curriculum requirements in Victorian Curriculum F-10, VCE and VCAL.
- Schools may invite parents to make a financial contribution to support the school.

PARENT PAYMENT REQUESTS

Schools can request contributions from parents under three categories:



Curriculum Contributions

Voluntary financial contributions for curriculum items and activities which the school deems necessary for students to learn the Curriculum.

Other Contributions

Voluntary financial contributions for non-curriculum items and activities that relate to the school's functions and objectives.

Extra-Curricular Items and Activities

Items and activities that enhance or broaden the schooling experience of students and are above and beyond what the school provides for free to deliver the Curriculum. These are provided on a user-pays basis.

 Schools may also invite parents to supply or purchase educational items to use and own (e.g. textbooks, stationery, digital devices).



FINANCIAL HELP FOR FAMILIES

- Schools put in place financial hardship arrangements to support families who cannot
 pay for items or activities so that their child doesn't miss out.
- Schools have a nominated parent payment contact person(s) that parents can have a confidential discussion with regarding financial hardship arrangements.



SCHOOL PROCESSES

 Schools must obtain school council approval for their parent payment arrangements and publish all requests and communications for each year level on their school website for transparency.
